Child Care Resource Centers coordinate and plan child care services within their communities and regions. They offer essential support to child care providers, parents, businesses, and local governments.

WHERE ARE CHILD CARE RESOURCE CENTERS?

There are 35 Child Care Resource Centers located throughout seven regions of New York State. Regions include: Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Albany, New York City, Hudson Valley, and Long Island.

HOW DO CHILD CARE RESOURCE CENTERS HELP FAMILIES?

Child Care Resource Centers help parents take the guesswork out of choosing care by providing:

- Referrals to local child care providers
- Information on state licensing requirements
- Information on where to get help paying for child care
- Resources and information on services for children with disabilities



HOW DO CHILD CARE RESOURCE CENTERS SUPPORT EARLY EDUCATORS?

Child Care Resource Centers build the supply of quality child care within their state and local communities. Services offered include providing coaching, technical assistance, and business training to child care programs to ensure that their businesses are sustainable. They also equip early childhood educators with professional support, education, resources, and grants to ensure that they are prepared to offer specialized care and education to children.
